## My opening comments:

Thanks to Martin Rogowsky and David Gelfarb for their comments and commentary on the County Executive's Privatization proposal. Given this background I'd like to make a couple of points very clear.

- The County Executive has a history of proposing major changes for Westchester County Airport policies and agreements in late Fall. The timing of these proposals limit review and public scrutiny prior to a vote by the Board of Legislators.
- Once "privatized" the public / citizens have no voice in the plans of the Airport. The current County Executive has not been transparent concerning plans for the airport. This lack of transparency and community involvement would be exacerbated if the ownership of the Westchester County Airport is transferred under "privatization" to an investor group.
- It is important for citizens to get educated about the airport privatization proposal and be prepared to go to a Board of legislators meeting to make sure our concerns are addressed <u>before</u> a decision is made.
